Answers

- 1 Church Cottage was built in 1770.
The plaque probably contains the words "Norwich Union", the figure of a person and a row of leaves. Plaques were put up by insurance companies to show that the building was insured. Each insurance company had its own emblem. This told firemen that the insurance company would cover the cost of putting out a fire!
The mortar contains small black pieces of ironstone.

- 3 The Manor House was built in 13th Century.
It is almost 800 years old.
- 4 Mole, Toad and Ratty are on E H Shepard's gravestone.
His palette was for holding and mixing his watercolour paints.

- 6 The Lodsworth villagers embroidered the tapestry to celebrate the Millennium.
Butterfly, bumblebee, squirrel, rabbit, robin, etc.
6 bell ropes to ring the 6 church bells.
- 7 Here between 1955-1976 lived the artist E.H.Shepard 1879-1976
illustrator of 'Winnie the Pooh' and 'The Wind in the Willows'
- 8 Lodsworth's vicar lived in the Old Vicarage.
- 9 The vicar took a short cut through these gates for walking from his vicarage to his church.
